The Climate of Matsuyama


The annual average temperature of the warm Seto Inland Sea climate is 16.5°C. Annual rainfall is about 1,300 mm, with more in June and little in December. With little rainfall, hardly any snow, and few typhoons, Matsuyama has a mild climate.

About Matsuyama City

Located in the central part of Ehime Prefecture, Matsuyama overlooks the Seto Inland Sea to the west, and the Shikoku Mountains to the east, with Mt. Ishizuchi, West Japan's highest peak. In 1873, Matsuyama was made the prefectural capital, and the city has since prospered as a political and economic centre. It's also a centre for regional culture that has produced many writers including the haiku poet Shiki Masaoka. The population is about 520,000. The city area is 429.40 km. The camellia is the city's flower.

The Attractions of Matsuyama

The city centre is compact, laid out in a grid around the castle. With islands, mountains and the sea, Matsuyama is blessed with a beautiful natural environment. Here you can enjoy a slower pace of life than in the big cities, with hot springs, great seafood and mandarin oranges, and other fresh fruit.



Getting to the castle by cable car, chairlift, and on foot

Take the cable car or chairlift from Matsuyama Castle Cable car platform on Ropeway Street. The cable car takes about 3 minutes and the chairlift about 6 minutes. From the Chōjaganaru Station, it takes about 10 minutes to the castle entrance. There are four paths up to the castle, and it takes about 20 or 30 minutes on foot. You're likely to encounter a variety of birds on the way.

Taking the cable car or chairlift

Buy a ticket at the vending machine on the first floor of Matsuyama Castle Cable car platform, and take the cable car or chairlift from the third floor. The cable car and chairlift cost ¥520 for adults both ways and ¥270 one way. Entry to Matsuyama Castle with a return ticket costs ¥1,040.





Matsuyama Castle

The view from the castle tower is superb. It offers a 360-degree panorama from Mt. Ishizuchi to the Seto Inland Sea. However the stairs up to the top are narrow and very steep, so caution is required.

❸ Gates 戸無門・筒井門・隠門

Gates are considered the key to the defense of a fortress. Matsuvama Castle has several fortified gates that are designated important national cultural properties. They each have various contrivances for protecting the castle from attackers.

②Stone Walls 石垣

Matsuyama Castle is also celebrated for the beauty of its stone walls. The indented stone walls of the main enclosure, soaring to a height of over 10 m, are particularly spectacular. The graceful curves are reminiscent of a folding fan.

4 Turrets 野原櫓・乾櫓

The Nohara turret dates from the time when the castle was built. It afforded protection at the back of the castle. To prevent them from being penetrated by bullets, the walls of the turrets are filled with tiles and pebbles.



Dress Up in Armour 甲冑体験

On the first floor of the castle tower is a corner where you can enjoy dressing up in armour (included in the castle entrance fee). A photo of yourself as a samurai makes a good memento of your visit.



Opening the Castle Gates 天守開門

At 9 am every Saturday, Sunday and national holiday, a drum is beaten inside the castle. The drum was traditionally used for various signalling purposes. When the drum sounds, visitors can push open the Ichinomon Gate, an important national cultural property.

Matsuyama Castle Ninomaru Historical Garden

松山城ニシ丸史跡庭園 (MAP)P7 C-2

The remains of Matsuvama Castle Ninomaru are preserved as a garden. The floor plan of the buildings that used to stand on the site is represented by water features, citrus trees and flowering shrubs. It has been designated a Lover's Sanctuary.

Ōkaidō

大街道商店街 (MAP) P7 E-2:3:4

Matsuyama's biggest shopping arcade stands across the road from Gintengai. It's home to smart cafés, boutiques and fashion goods stores.



Gintengai

松山銀天街商店街 (MAP)P7 C·D-4

This shopping arcade links Matsuyama City Station and Ōkaidō. This covered shopping area is pleasant even when it rains.



Matsuchika Town

まつちかタウン (MAP) P7 C-4

This is Shikoku's only underground shopping centre. This road linking Matsuyama City Station, lyotetsu Takashimaya department store and Gintengai is lined with classic clothing shops and restaurants.



Shiroyama Park 城山公園 (MAP) P7 B·C-2

This spacious grassy area overlooks Matsuyama Castle

and the Ninomaru area. The public area is suitable for light sports such as playing catch. Various events are held here at weekends.



Ropeway Street

ロープウェー街 (MAP) P7 E-1・2

This shopping street is convenient for Matsuyama Castle cable car and chairlift station, and the birthplace of the Akiyama Brothers. There are also many restaurants and shops selling Ehime specialties.



Matsuyama City Station

松山市駅 (MAP) P7 B-4

As the terminal for lyotetsu suburban trains, this station links central Matsuvama and the suburbs. It's also a stop for the trams that run in the city centre, making it convenient for tourism. There are shopping districts near the station, and plenty of bars and restaurants. Also, there's a free and unique Botchan train museum near the station where you can see replica of the Botchan train.



Saka no Ue no Kumo Museum

坂の上の雲ミュージアム (MAP)P7 D-2

This museum is dedicated to the novel Saka no Ue no Kumo by Ryōtarō Shiba. It presents the Meiji period lives of brothers Yoshifuru and Saneyuki Akiyama, and Shiki Masaoka, who all came from Matsuyama. The building was designed by celebrated architect Tadao Ando.

Bansuisō Villa

This French-style château was built in 1922. It's designated an important national cultural property. Bansuisō is home to art exhibitions, concerts and other






The Museum of Art, Ehime 愛媛県美術館 (MAP) P7 B-3

Dōgo Onsen Honkan


Dōgo Onsen Main Building began its full-scale conservation repair works on Jan. 15, 2019. The 2nd & the 3rd Floor are closed, but Kami-No-Yu on the 1st floor is available.

How to Bathe in Dogo Onsen Honkan

After purchasing your ticket, proceed to the immediately adjacent separate men's and women's changing rooms on the 1st floor.

Dōgo Onsen Honkan

道後温泉本館 (MAP) P12 B-2

Dōgo Onsen, Japan's oldest hot spring, boasts a 3,000-year history. It was recorded in the ancient Chronicles of Japan. Dogo Onsen Honkan which houses the spring was rebuilt in 1894. In 2009. it was awarded three stars by the Michelin Green Guide Japan. **2**: 089-921-5141



Shinrokaku

The White Heron Watchtower on top of Dōgo Onsen Honkan is glazed with red glass made in Belgium. Inside the tower hangs a drum which is used to announce the time at 6 am, noon and 6 pm.



Dogo Onsen Sky Walker

This hiking path and lookout point are located on Mount Kanmuri, south of Dogo Onsen Honkan. Enjoy a relaxing foot bath while taking in the view of the Honkan building and other local scenery. The night views are especially enchanting. The wisteria trellises and seasonal flowers are also impressive. The foot bath is open from 6:00 to 21:00.



Spring Quality of Dōgo Onsen 道後温泉の泉質

Alkaline hot spring water is very gentle on the skin, making it ideal for spa and beauty treatment. For optimum effect, the hot spring water of Dogo Onsen is direct from the source with no reheating or added water.






Strolling in Yukata 浴衣で散策

Overview of Asuka-no-Yu

Asuka-no-Yu is housed in a bathing facility that has hosted imperial guests, including Prince Shotoku in 596 and Empress Kogyoku in 661. It features an architectural style dating back to the Asuka Period (538–710).

Choose a plan from the chart on the right. The second floor features a large. shared resting area as well as private resting rooms and special bathing rooms, where guests can enjoy tea with sweets.

Dōgo Onsen Annex Asuka-no-Yu

道後温泉別館 飛鳥乃湯泉 (MAP) P12 B-2

The 1st floor bathing room features Tobe ware ceramic wall panels describing the sacred Mount Ishizuchi and the Seto Inland Sea, just like in Dogo Onsen Honkan. The open-air baths are also ornamented with impressive, masterfully-crafted decorative wooden panels of Ehime-grown Japanese cypress which convey the natural majesty of both the mountains and the sea. **2**: 089-932-1126



2nd floor special private bathing room

One is designed as a re-creation of "Yushinden" for the imperial family at Dogo Onsen Honkan, and the other features lyo-su and ceiling illustrations in a modern style. (The photograph is the Yushinden bath re-creation.)



Tsubaki-no-Ma (Camellia Room)

One of the five private room on the second floor. The room's design uses Imabari towels to adopt a camellia forest theme based on the text of the Yuoka-no-Hi inscribed stone left by Prince Shotoku during his visit to Dogo Hot Springs. The other four lounge similarly use traditional Ehime craft products to express themes related to Dōgo's history.

Asuka-no-Yu as a Hub of Novel Hot Spring Culture 新たな温泉文化を発信する拠点



Asuka-no-Yu, an annex of Dogo Onsen, incorporates Dogo Hot Springs history and legend alongside traditional Ehime crafts such as Iyo-kasuri (dyed-pattern fabrics), Iyo bamboo ware and Ozu washi (traditional paper) based on an "ancient Dogo" theme. These elements are combined with the latest contemporary art styles to create fascinating designs and works that exude a new type of hot spring culture while also

offering the soothing relaxation inherent to the hot spring experience. In these ways, Asuka-no-Yu aims to be a hub of novel hot spring culture.






Foot Spa

Botchan Karakuri Clock

坊っちゃんカラクリ時計 (MAP) P12 B-2

This robot clock in front of Dōgo Onsen Station is modeled on the White Heron Watchtower of Dogo Onsen Honkan. Between 8:00 and 22:00 on the hour, the clock comes to life with scenes from Sōseki Natsume's novel Botchan.



Dōgo Onsen Tsubaki-no-Yu

道後温泉椿の湯 (MAP) P12 B-2

The sister to Dōgo Onsen Honkan. With a larger bath than the Honkan, this is very popular with local people.

Dogo Park (Yuzuki Castle Ruins)

道後公園 (湯築城跡) (MAP) P12 B·C-3·4

This park is the former site of Yuzuki Castle, the base of the Kōno clan in the Middle Ages. A stone fountain once used in Dōgo Onsen Honkan is displayed here. There's an excellent view from the observation platform. There's also the Yuzukijō Castle Museum. 25: 089-941-1480



Botchan Train

坊っちゃん列車 (MAP) P12 B-3

These replica steam locomotives are mentioned in Sōseki Natsume's novel Botchan, set in Matsuvama. These environmentally responsible diesel trains run serving a route through central Matsuyama.

Dōgo Arcade

This L-shaped shopping arcade links Dōgo Onsen Station and Dōgo Onsen Honkan. The arcade is lined with souvenir shops packed with Ehime products, chic cafés, and restaurants offering local specialties.



Nikitatsu no Michi

にきたつの道 (MAP) P12 A·B-2

Nikitatsu no Michi extends west from the middle of Dogo Arcade. On this beautiful stone-paved street with its little stream stands the old sake brewery, Minakuchi Shuzō.



Seki Art Gallery

セキ美術館 (MAP) P12 A-2

5 min. on foot from Dogo Onsen Sta. This gallery has outstanding works by Yokovama Taikan. Matazō Kayama, Ryōhei Koiso and other modern Japanese artists, along with a large marble sculpture by Auguste Rodin and other pieces. ☎: 089-946-5678 Open: 10:00 to 17:00

Dōgo Giyaman Glass Museum

and it flourished as Matsuyama's gateway to the sea. The area is now enjoying something of a revival.

Kimuratei

This house was built in 1881 by merchants who served as shipping agents in Mitsuhama. The design features magnificent beams and windows between floors to let in light. Mt. Koshiore

腰折山 (MAP) P36 D-1

This small mountain is about 500 m from the start of the footpath to the summit. There are great views of Mt. Takanawa and the sea around Kashima Island.



Kashima Island

鹿島 (MAP) P36 D-1

This small island sits off the coast of Hōjō. It's 400 m high, and 1.5 km round. With cherry blossoms in spring, swimming in summer, and fishing in winter, there's something to enjoy in every season. Visitors can even feed deer in the deer park area.



Lover's Sanctuary 恋人の聖地サテライト MAP P36 D-1

Kashima has been designated a "Lover's Sanctuary", as a romantic spot suitable for proposing marriage. This is because the shrine on the island is dedicated to matchmaking, and two rocky outcrops off Kashima are joined with a straw rope as if in marriage. There's a commemorative monument on the observation platform, and if a couple rings the lucky bell, they may realize their love. (The two joined, rocky outcrops can be seen from both the sightseeing boats and the observation platform.)











Kutsuna Islands 忽那諸島 MAPP36 A·B·C-1·2·3·4

The Kutsuna Islands comprise nine inhabited islands including Nakajima and Gogoshima, and more than 30 other islands. Here you can enjoy island pursuits including swimming in the sea from beautiful beaches, marine sports, fishing, and eating fresh seafood. You can get to the various islands by car ferry and high-speed boat from Matsuvama.

Beach and Barbecue Equipment 海水浴・バーベキューの器具について

The Kutsuna Islands are popular as resort islands where you can relax for the day in a peaceful natural environment. Himegahama Beach on Nakajima is especially popular. You can hire tents to stay in and barbecue equipment.

About the Shikoku Pilgrimage

By visiting these temples, you can experience the unique o-henro

四国遍路とは

pilgrimage culture of Shikoku.

The Buddhist monk Köbö Daishi, also known as Kükai, is said to have established the pilgrimage of 88 temples after the year in 815. Since then and to this day, many pilgrims, known as o-henro, have taken the pilgrimage for the purpose of prayer, contemplation, or tourism. From old times, the people of Shikoku have welcomed pilgrims with spiritually-motivated hospitality called o-settai. The pilgrimage route is about 1,400 km round. It takes about 40 days to walk it. Besides walking, pilgrims travel on bus tours, by car or bicycle.

Etiquette of the Shikoku Pilgrimage 四国遍路の作法



At the main gate, greet the Buddha and the Daishi with a bow before entering the temple. Remember to bow again when you leave.




Go to the water basin and rinse your left hand, right hand then your mouth. Rinsing your mouth represents the purification of your body, inside and out.




Offer a candle and several sticks of incense. Three sticks has various meanings such as the past, present, and future, your ancestors, yourself, and your descendants.



Instead of a visiting card, pilgrims put a votive card in the special box. Quietly put a donation in the offertory box without throwing it.







Matsuyamazushi and Five-Coloured Noodles

松山鮓・五色そうめん

Matsuyamazushi is a treat made on festival days. Rice is flavoured with fish stock and vinegar, topped generously with Setouchi fish and eel, and vegetables in season. Five-coloured noodles have been produced continuously from the Edo period. With the yellow of egg, the green of tea, the brown of buckwheat, the red of plum and shiso, and plain white, the noodles are a pretty sight.

Sea Bream Rice

鯛めし

Sea bream, harvested from the Seto Inland Sea, is grilled to perfection then steamed on a bed of rice. The succulent fish meat is then stirred into the rice with root vegetables. The rich fish flavour infuses every grain of rice, producing an elegant and deeply satisfying dish. This cuisine symbolizes the heartfelt hospitality of Matsuyama.

Iyo Kasuri Fabric

伊予

In the late Edo period, Kana Kagiya, a woman from Matsuyama, was inspired by a pattern appearing on old roofs and came up with the design of Iyo Kasuri. Iyo Kasuri is known as one of the three main types of dyed fabric patterns in Japan.

Hime Daruma Dolls

姫だる

A long time ago, the Empress Jingū is said to have stayed at Dōgo Onsen where she conceived a child. The Hime Daruma was made to commemorate the pretty child. The dolls are considered to bring good fortune.

Citrus Fruits and Desserts

柑橘・柑橘のデザート

Matsuyama produces so many citrus fruits that it's known as 'the mandarin kingdom'. There are several types that are unique to Matsuyama such as Miyauchi lyokan, as well as types that were developed here recently like Beni Madonna and Setoka. You can also enjoy many other food products that use citrus, such as gelato, ice cream, jelly and juice. There are numerous juice stands around Matsuyama.



Taruto and Botchan Dango

タルト・坊っちゃん団子

Taruto is a well-known confection of Matsuyama, combining yuzu-flavoured bean paste and sponge cake. Botchan dango is a three-coloured sweet which is served in Dōgo Onsen Honkan.

Bamboo Craft

竹工芸

These bamboo craft items are woven individually by craftsmen using Ehime's high quality bamboo. In 596, when Shōtoku Taishi came to bathe in Dōgo Onsen, he saw the abundant bamboo forests and taught the local people how to weave baskets. This is said to be the origin of the craft.



Local Sake and Dogo Beer

松山の地酒・道後ビール

The warm climate and rich soil of the Setouchi region, combined with traditional skill, results in fine sake. Matsuyama's sake made using pure water and high quality brewing rice is highly regarded in Japan and abroad. The sake brewery in Dōgo also makes craft beer.

Mid Aug. **Matsuyama Festival**

This festival began in 1966 as one of Shikoku's four biggest festivals. As the home of baseball in Japan, teams of dancers perform charming and acrobatic baseball-themed dances in a parade through the centre of the city.



北条鹿島まつり

This is a traditional spring festival. Designated an intangible folk-cultural property of Ehime, young men perform dances on boats in celebration of the sea battles fought here in ancient times. The huge straw rope between the husband and wife rocks is also replaced once a year during the festival.



Oct. 5th-7th **Regional Festivals**

Various festivals are held in each part of Matsuvama to celebrate the fertility of the seasons. One of these is the awesome spectacle of "Hachiawase" in Dōgo, where battles between sacred palanquins take place after the bearers issue provocative calls to "Bring it on!"

Early Aug. Mitsuhama Fireworks

松山港まつり三津浜花火大会

This is one of Shikoku's biggest firework festivals. In this display lasting 60 minutes, many fireworks are launched from piers and on the surface of the sea. Enjoy this fantastic display with food and drinks from the many stalls lining the streets of the port.



Ehime Marathon

This takes place every February. This full marathon starts in front of the Ehime Prefectural Office and ends in Shiroyama Park, Lots of local people line the streets to cheer on the citizen runners giving their all. Runners from overseas are welcome.
